Like you, Border Trust, the region's Community Foundation believes that every child deserves a good start to the school year.

The Back to School Program aims to give this good start to students-in-need by providing a \$50 Target voucher to help them when they need it most.

WHAT IS THE BACK TO SCHOOL PROGRAM?

Back to School is a national program coordinated by the Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal (FRRR) and administered locally by Border Trust. We work directly with Principals and Welfare Officers at local primary & secondary schools who request vouchers to assist their students with the greatest need. This may be due to mental health issues, unemployment, social isolation, drought and other environmental & health issues.

At the start of the 2018 school year, we provided 949 vouchers to students across 76 regional schools. A fantastic effort, but still the need grows.

CAN A \$50 VOUCHER REALLY MAKE A DIFFERENCE?

Most definitely, yes. Vouchers can be used for school bags, jumpers, shoes, text books, socks & underwear, uniforms, even toiletries. We want students to feel they fit-in & not stand-out.

WHAT IS THE 2019 BACK TO SCHOOL CHALLENGE?

From September – November, we're raising funds locally which FRRR will aim to match. So, for every \$50 raised, the potential is for 2 students to benefit. All funds raised stay 100% local and go directly to the purchase of vouchers for schools to distribute to their students.

SHARING THE STORIES

"One mother (who has recently moved here due to domestic violence) cried and cried. They did not have the basics eg lunchbox, back pack etc as it was all left behind. She was really appreciative. The student came and showed me his new items and was so excited he was just like the other students.

Another family has several children – they were really appreciative as they could go and buy them new underwear and socks. The students had outgrown the ones they had. All families were thrilled and the vouchers have made such a difference in a big way – confidence, feeling that they belong and socially. It has also taken the pressure off some families to get items that they had been putting off due to a lack of finances." Welfare Officer
